Message from Dave Bradford, Post 194 Chaplain: As I write this, we are approaching the start of the Lenten season which begins Wednesday February 17th and culminates on Easter Sunday April 4th. The Lenten season for Christians is 40 days of prayer, fasting, self-denial, and almsgiving. For those of you counting, Sundays are free of fasting, so if you take them out, you get 40 liturgical days.

Now I'm fascinated by numbers that repeat. So, what is it with the number 40 in the Bible? How does that translate into our modern Lenten season of 40 days? Let's see, God destroyed the world by making it rain for 40 days and 40 nights; Jesus fasted and faced His trials in the desert for 40 days; and the Jews wandered in the desert for 40 years. And, I'm sure that there are many more that could be catalogued. However, rather than a hard number, I believe that the number 40 just represents a "long time or long process"...a time/ process of testing, waiting, praying, cleansing, and finally transformation. So, as we approach this Lenten season maybe our act of self-denial should be a little more than giving up our favorite chocolate bar or French fries. I mean how spiritually cleansing or transformative could that possibly be, except maybe to our waistline.

As Christians, we believe that Christ died for our sins on Good Friday (Luke 22:14-20..."my blood, which is poured out as a sacrifice for you.") and rose again to fulfill scripture on what we now call Easter Sunday. Compared to those words, our self-denial of that chocolate bar or French fries appears somewhat inadequate don't you think? In the early church, new converts to Christianity were adults, who were required to undergo a "long process" in preparation for Baptism. They were mentored in Christian life and were required to faithfully live a life that was demonstrative of Jesus' commandment to Love one another. They also learned how to pray, fast, and give alms. This period of learning and preparation continued through an all-night vigil on Holy Saturday culminating on Sunday morning (Easter/ Resurrection Day) with their Baptism into the body of Christ and consummating that union by receiving the Eucharist. Most of us know that as receiving Communion. In the modern church, we no longer have that long period of preparation, but we do have the Lenten season each year; 40 days to think, pray, fast, give alms and practice a Christian lifestyle. So, how are you being transformed this Lenten season? What sacrifice are you making that was worthy of being joined to Christ's sacrifice on the cross?

Romans 6:5-6: "For if we have been united with him in a death like His, we will certainly also be united with Him in a resurrection like his. For we know that our old self was crucified with Him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin."The Grace of our Lord, the Love of God, and the Fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all!
