2020 Membership Dues – A note to all Post 194 regular members – As of January

Message from Post 194 Chaplain Dave Bradford:

In the last two newsletters, I've been talking about the Why and How of prayer. And, for those who are regular church goers, you've undoubtedly heard your priest, minister, or church leader speaking about the power of, and the necessity for prayer. But, for me one of the most important reasons for prayer is the recognition that there is a supreme power that transcends all of us. We have a creator, whose only begotten Son will one day hold us accountable in final judgement. And, in the meantime, we need to be asking for guidance to get it right; to be doing God's will.

It is our responsibility and obligation to pass along the practice of prayer to our family. We do that by diligently and publicly acknowledging our need to turn to God in prayer on a regular basis, including keeping The Sabbath. Most children learn to say their nightly prayers because Mom or dad tells them to. But later they may fall away from the practice because they never see Mom or dad on their knees praying to God. The act of saying grace; of giving thanks before meals seems in many cases to be another practice that has fallen by the wayside. Going to church on Sunday also seems to have become an inconvenience.

The Preamble to the American Legion Constitution calls for us to "foster and perpetuate a one hundred percent Americanism...". The Pledge of Allegiance calls us "one nation under God". Our currency states, "In God we Trust". So, unless we are teaching our children, grand-children, and great-grandchildren what it means to trust in God and be one nation under God, it would seem that we are not living up to our responsibilities as parents and legionnaires. Setting daily example of praying in a family setting at meals, before bedtime, and attending church on Sunday are great ways to begin.

The greatest compliment that I've ever heard an adult child say about her dead father was that she remembered him praying on his knees every night before bed, and never missing church on Sunday. This man was a farmer who knew just how much he depended on God for his very existence. Knowing that we come from God, depend upon God, can trust in God, and one day will return to God, are gifts that we should faithfully transmit to our families daily. Blessings to All.
