**Daily Lunches -** We offer daily lunches during the weekdays from 11:30 AM - 1:00 PM. A limited "Lunch Menu" is offered at a reasonable price.

Saturday Night Bingo - We have Bingo here at the Post home on every Saturday night from 6:30 – 9:30 PM. The menu will include scrambled eggs, bacon, scrapple, sausage, sausage gravy, fried potatoes, toast, biscuits, and will be served with coffee and juices. Cost is \$9.00 a person.

75th Anniversary Dinner for Members of Post 194 - Just over 75 years ago, a group of young men met with the purpose of establishing a place where they could associate with other veterans who just returned from years of war. They also felt a need and a continued call to service, service to their fellow veterans and service to their communities. It began in March of 1946 when this small group petitioned the American Legion for a charter which was granted in June of that year. I don't believe anyone could have predicted that the post would grow from the pre-charter group of 41 into the Post of well over 600 members that it is today. And that doesn't include S.A.L. and Auxiliary members.

So, we are excited and have a lot to celebrate. The center piece is the 75th Anniversary Celebration Dinner scheduled for Sunday September 19. There is a dress code for this event. Tickets are being sold at the bar for \$20.00 each. The dinner ticket holder will receive a wine glass with the 75th Anniversary logo, a logo pin, and each family will receive a 75th Anniversary booklet. The dinner menu includes Filet Mignon and Crab Cake. Currently, there are about 60 tickets yet to be sold. #### Chaplain's Message (From David Bradford, Post 194 Chaplain) -

The motto of the American Legion is "For God and Country". This motto is important in that it reminds us that there is something bigger/ greater than ourselves and our own personal needs/ wants/ desires. In 2018, Sholto Byrnes, a senior fellow at the Institute of Strategic and International Studies Malaysia, opined that religion (see Romans 13:1-5) is the bedrock of any society (Acts 2: 46,47) and is firmly rooted in most societal norms and in the legal system. He went on to say that dismantling or removing the bedrock of religion leaves a moral vacuum. Fyodor Dostoevsky, the famous Russian novelist, once wrote, "Without God, everything is permitted."

Unfortunately, there have been several studies that indicate that America and Europe have a dwindling portion of their populations that are active church goers or who actively define themselves with a religious affiliation (see Revelations 20: 7-9; Isaiah 45).

Like most of you, I listen to the evening news and some opinion shows. And, I suspect like many, I'm appalled by the continual debate of late term abortions(see Genesis 1:27; Psalm 127:3; Exodus 20:13), the endless recitation of weekend murder statistics (see 1 John 3:11-15; Matthew 5:21), the fact that the richest nation on earth has an increasing homeless population, terrorists attacking the right of a nation to exist, the human tragedy at our southern border, the latest government give-a-way and disincentive to work and be a productive citizen (see 2 Thessalonians 3:7-9), and continuing efforts to define citizens of our great country by the color of their skin instead of the value of their character (see Romans 15:2 and 7; Colossians 3:11-13).

In JFK's inaugural address, he called upon us to be unwilling to witness or permit the slow undoing of those human rights to which America has always been committed. He went on to say, "In the long history of the world, only a few generations have been granted the role of defending freedom in its hour of maximum danger." I would strongly urge everyone to get and read a copy of The Bill of Rights, as it's hard to defend that which you do not know.

In an article in the Atlantic, Tim LaHaye wrote, "America's uniqueness is based upon the Christian consensus of our Founding Fathers, who penned documents guaranteeing religious and personal freedom for all." He went on to say," America's founding was based more on biblical principles than any other nation on earth – and that's the main reason this country has been more blessed by God than any other nation in history.

So there is a reason that "God" appears first in the American Legion Motto, and that the words I or me are not included. In1936, FDR said, "To some generations, much is given. Of other generations, much is expected. This generation has a rendezvous with destiny." In this day and age, this sounds like a very appropriate challenge. How will you respond?
