Special Notice To All American Legion Post 194 Regular Members – Constitution & By-Laws Update – All Members are hereby officially notified that the American Legion Mason Dixon Post 194 has updated our current Constitution & By-Laws in accordance with specific guidance and instruction from the American Legion National Headquarters in Indianapolis, IN and from the Department of Maryland Headquarters in Baltimore, MD. The purpose of this updating of our Mason Dixon Post 194 Constitution & By-Laws is to ensure that the Post 194 is "consistent with" and in "total agreement with" the Constitution & By-Laws of the American Legion Department of MD and the National American Legion Headquarters. We have been instructed to take the appropriate action to complete this update by December 31, 2019. Prior to making any changes to our Constitution & By-Laws, we were required to bring this issue up at three consecutive meetings so that the members have an opportunity to participate in this process. We have duly raised this issue up at our last three general membership meetings held in June, July, and August meetings. At our September general membership meeting, we approved our new Constitution and By-Laws.

Chaplain's Message (Dave Bradford)

In the last newsletter, I commented on prayer and the need to be attuned to God's voice. We need to pray and God, our Creator, wants us to pray. Each day presents new challenges, obstacles, opportunities, and temptations. And, I'm often anxious and fretting over my response to those challenges. Philippians 4:6-7 states "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." So instead of fretting over the problems of the day, turn them over to God. True Prayer is the act of turning these challenges over to God and placing your trust (Faith) solely in Him.

Ever notice when you are consumed by a problem and have said "God, help me.", and the next day you seemingly awoke with a resolution in mind? Maybe it's because God listened to your prayer. And while how to make the next car payment might not elicit a response (a worldly issue), how to avoid the temptations of the evil one (a spiritual issue) most certainly will.

Some also believe that because God has already equipped them to handle all the trials and obstacles that life will place in their way, that they do not need to pray for help. But, knowing when to ask for God's help is part of what He gave you. So, most often that petition is for enlightenment and the strength to do what is right. And, often you awaken with an entirely different resolution in mind.

Faith, Persistence and Practice are keys to effective prayer. May the peace of our Lord be always with you.
