Daily Lunches - We offer daily lunches during the weekdays from 11:30 AM – 1:00 PM. A limited "Lunch Menu" is offered at a reasonable price.

We have a group of volunteers who help out on every Tuesday night so that you can have your hamburger the way you like it. The burgers are \$5.00 and will be made from fresh hamburger (not frozen). Your burger will come with potato chips or you can purchase French Fries at an additional cost.



American Legion Riders Sunday Morning Breakfast – The American Legion Riders of Post 194 are also hoping to be able to resume their "buffetstyle breakfast" sometime in the upcoming months. Due to the Pandemic crisis, no decision has been made yet as to when we will resume these breakfasts.



Friday Night Music – Our schedule for our Friday Entertainment continues to change on a weekly basis. We are unable to publish a schedule because it can change at any minute due to the current Pandemic Rules and Regulations. Saturday Night Bingo – We have Bingo here at the Post home every Saturday night from 4:00-9:30 PM. Ticket <u>Sales begin at 5:30 PM.</u> The first game begins at 6:30 PM. We offer a series of regular bingo games and a variety of special games, including 2 Cover-All Jackpot Games. Our bingo kitchen is open from 4:00 – 8:30 PM every Saturday night. A variety of food items are offered on our kitchen menu.

75th Anniversary Events Being Planned Mason Dixon Post 194 – Our American Legion Post 194 75th Anniversary planning committee have worked very hard in putting together what will be an outstanding event for our 75th Year Anniversary celebration. We have planned a special dinner that will occur on Sunday afternoon, April 11, 2021. They are in the process of finalizing the various events that will occur at this dinner. Due to several restrictions we are faced with, we will only have seating for approximately 180 people for this event. A strict dress code for those will be adhered to for those attending this anniversary dinner. Tickets will be \$15.00 each. Additional information about this dinner event be provided in the very near future. Tickets to this Anniversary Dinner will be available, beginning sometime in early December 2020. Due to the limited seating capability and to the need to be able to invite certain key members who have taken a very active role in our Post 194 development during the past 75 years, we will be selective as to who will be able purchase a ticket to this event. Due to limited seating, we suggest purchasing tickets early.

Membership Meetings - The general membership meetings (Regular Members, Auxiliary Unit, and SAL) are normally held on the 4th Thursday of each month begin at 7:00 PM. **Aspecial reminder to all members: Due to the upcoming Christmas holiday our monthly membership meetings in** <u>December</u> will be held on the 3rd Thursday in December (Dec. 19).

SAL Shrimp Dinners - The SAL Squadron #194 typically have their Sunday Shrimp Dinners on the second and fourth Sundays during the months of January, February, and March. <u>The Shrimp Dinners</u> will be from 1:00 – 5:00 PM and the menu will consist of the following:

Friday Night Dinners Suspended – The American Legion Unit 194 Auxiliary are also hoping to be able to resume their Friday Dinners at some point in the future months. Once we are given the okay to restart these dinners, the Friday night dinners will be from 5:30 – 7:00 PM on the 1st Friday night of every month until April in the Spring. These dinners are \$10.00 per person and are a buffet style dinner consisting of a choice of two meats and a variety of other food items such as mashed potatoes, gravy, green beans, and salad. These dinners are a source of funds that the Auxiliary uses to help pay for the many programs they provide to the Veterans and to this community. Chaplain's Message (Dave Bradford)

As I sit here writing this note, it is six days prior to Thanksgiving, and just over a month to Christmas. By this time of the year, my head should be aswirl with thoughts of everything for which I should be Thankful. But alas, like many people, I suspect, I'm having a difficult time reconciling the pandemic, the lockdowns, the loss of personal freedoms, the lack of in-person church services, and the absolutely corrosive political environment with the concept of Thankfulness and Gratefulness. Luckily there remain some activities that allow me to focus on something other than self.

Yesterday, for example, several of us participated in the distribution of food baskets to needy families. That simple act was so gratifying. And if you are unaware, our Legion, through the school district, distributes food for 18 families in western Cecil County. We do this prior to every Thanksgiving and every Christmas. These baskets are packed full of food, including all the trimmings for a sumptuous family holiday dinner including Turkey and dessert. A simple act, overflowing with reasons to be Thankful and Grateful.
